

# RAA Flood Grant – Storm & Flood Industry Recovery Program – Expires 3 March 2022 Supply Chain Support Grant Rural Landholders Grant

Funding and projects under the SFIRP Supply Chain Support Grant will complement the <u>\$75,000 Special Disaster Grant</u>. and support NSW's agriculture, horticulture and aquaculture industries to rebuild and recover in the medium and longer-term.

Eligible primary producers are required to have accessed the full \$75,000 Special Disaster Grant before accessing funds through the Supply Chain Support Grant.

The amount of funding available to eligible producers in targeted industries will vary by industry and a 50:50 financial and/or in-kind co-contribution from applicants is required.

## **RAA - Farm Innovation Fund Loans**

The NSW Government has committed \$1 billion to the Farm Innovation Fund under the Emergency Drought Relief Package 2019-20. From 1 July 2019, farmers can borrow up to a maximum of \$1 million per project, with a total of \$1,000,000 outstanding at any one time to build on-farm infrastructure, including stock containment areas. In addition, interest charges on Farm Innovation Fund loans for the 2019-20 financial year will also be waived. Loans are now available from the NSW Rural Assistance Authority to assist with drought preparedness, environment, farm infrastructure and natural resources works. Loans up to \$1,000,000, up to a 20-year term, current interest rate is 2.5% which is fixed for the term of the loan.

## **Income Support for Farmers - Farm Household Allowance**

**New amendment and simplification of the application process**; A new online claim that can be used by both members of a couple. Relief measures #2 2019 - Commences 11 June 2020

The Farm Household Allowance (FHA) will help farmers with their daily living expenses, and is available to farmers Australia wide, <u>without</u> the need for a drought declaration. This allowance will provide eligible farmers and their partners with up to four years of income support. This payment is equivalent to the Newstart Allowance and is paid fortnightly.

**The Activity Supplement** will increase to \$10,000 in the person's lifetime. Amount already spent are included in the total. Extending it to include travel and accommodation costs associated with eligible activities.

Simplified assets test will mean all assets (farm and non-farm) will be counted under a single net value threshold of \$5.5 million.

**One rate of payment** will mean no fluctuations due to income. Anyone who qualifies for a cent will automatically receive the maximum applicable rate of payment.

## RIC - Regional Investment Corporation: Concessional Loans

Low interest loans - Drought and Farm investment loans to assist with preparation for drought and recovery from drought. Loans can refinance existing debt or access new debt for operating expenses. Loans are available up to \$2,000,000. Current terms will be:

Drought Loan and AgBiz Drought Loans will have:

- 5 years interest only at the current variable rate of 2.17% then
- 5 years' principal and interest over a 10-year loan term.

### **RIC Agri starter Loans**

Low interest loans to assist first time farmers and loans to support farm succession arrangements.

Eligible first-time farmers wanting to buy, established or develop their first farm, or farmers and farm businesses who are planning for and implementing succession arrangements. Loans available up to \$2 Million. 50% of your total debt must stay with a commercial lender.

Current terms would be:

- 5 years' interest only at the current variable rate of 2.17%
- 5 years' principal and interest over a 10-year loan term.

# Safe Work NSW \$500 Small business rebate

\$500 rebate for Safety Solutions, see attached link for detail on eligibility and how to apply.

The rebate provides up to \$500 to small business owners and sole traders in NSW who buy and install equipment to make their workplace safer.

Changes have been made to support small business and sole traders in NSW that have recently been impacted by a natural disaster, state of emergency or COVID-19

- 1. Any sole trader or small business owner that has completed an eligible event with SafeWork after 1 August 2019 has 12 months to apply for the rebate.
- 2. New workplace hygiene items are also eligible. Please check "What can I buy? Hygiene products" below for more information.

If you are a sole trader, the owner of a small business or a not-for-profit organisation in NSW, you may be eligible for a small business fees and charges rebate of \$1,500.

This rebate helps businesses recover from the impacts of COVID-19 and encourages growth by reducing the cost of running a business. Eligible businesses or not-for-profits only need to apply for the rebate once but can submit multiple claims until the full value of \$1,500 is reached.
